FROM THE PRINCIPAL

CALENDAR OF EVENTS

Kia Ora Koutou,

I'm delighted to inform you that we are finally in our latest new building (Te Moana). Teachers supported by our senior students did the move on Monday. It was amazing to see how quickly this was accomplished with normal classes beginning during the day. A huge thank you to everyone who managed to achieve this in such a short period of time. Our technology teachers have also "Returned Home" on Monday. They also managed a significant move, shifting three classes from the Hall into Te Horoeka in the afternoon block. They were very pleased to have the air conditioned spaces back during the last couple of very hot days.

As the Hall was vacated by the Tech team on Monday, we were able to host the Kahui Ako partnering schools for the parent evening with Dr Lucy Hone. We have 85 members of our school community attend which was a great turnout. Thank you to our team of teachers who prioritised this as an important event and came along. I did manage to chat with several parents following the presentation. All were very impressed with the helpful tips and insightful information Lucy shared. This presentation builds on the school wide professional development which is a focus for us at Lincoln Primary School this year. Lucy's definition of Well Being is "Feeling good and functioning well" has certainly been adopted by us. This simple but accurate definition might help you to relate to what well being is within your family lives.

Measles Outbreak

We are taking precautionary action to ensure or school is proactive in minimising the risk to students and staff in relation to the current measles outbreak.

When we checked out database regarding immunisation status of our students, we identified 175 students who were either not immunised or their status was unknown. Emma and Kate, in the office have been contacting parents to clarify which students have been immunised and need their status updated. As the majority of our teachers fall within the age bracket of 25-50 years of age and have had only one measles immunisation, we are being very cautious as they are more susceptible than those who have received double vaccinations, or those who have been exposed to measles prior to the introduction of the MMR vaccination programme. We also have a significant number of young female teachers who fall into this age range who could or have confirmed that they are pregnant. We do not wish to place these teachers in an "At risk" environment, so any children who are showing as "Unknown" or not immunised on the database will be removed from these learning spaces and placed into other teams who are at lesser risk. They will continue to have an academic programme delivered during the "at risk" period. We are also not holding any full school assemblies until we have more information regarding the current outbreak, and know that it is safe to have a large group of children confined to a small space for a prolonged period of time.

If you know that your child has been fully immunised but you did not bring along the immunisation chart when you enrolled them, can you please send a photo of the immunisation certificate to admin@lincolnprimary.ac.nz, and we will update our database.

I wish to sincerely thank those parents who have had concerns regarding their children's health, and have taken all steps possible to ensure all of our students are safe. We do not currently have any students who have been identified as being in contact with a confirmed case of measles or who are being monitored by medical professionals in regards to measles.

Community Cultural Narrative with Liz Brown

A Cultural Narrative is a presentation to provide insight into the cultural history of our local surroundings to allow these aspects to be incorporated into the design of existing and new buildings at our school. The term 'design' refers to buildings and plants, curriculum, values, kaupapa aspects of our school. The Cultural Narrative is presented by Taumutu Rūnanga to support schools and communities engage with Te Ao Māori (The Māori World). This includes mana whenua, whakapapa and cultural history of Lincoln and wider surroundings.


Second Hand Uniform Shop
