Today seven of our students were given the opportunity to attend the annual Yarrs Flat Biodiversity Monitoring day. The purpose of this day is to record how planting has progressed from last year, to record the type and number of the different birds and insect species in the area, to make suggestions as to improvements to the area for the use of the general public and to attend a workshop run by Matt Sanford from Enviroschool on Aquatic Life within the Yarrs Flat area. There is a number of mufti items in the lost property. These items will be donated if not collected by the end of this week. The lost property is located outside Korimako (modular building beside the junior playground)

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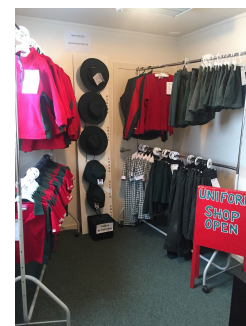

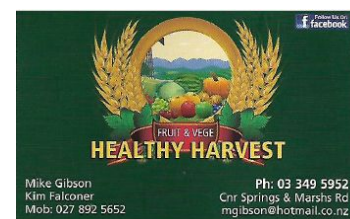
