Parent Forum Meetings - Lincoln Primary School Junior Campus

Modular Classroom Site Works

Phase One

The first phase of the engagement will involve face-to-face public workshops and an online survey to gather and explore ideas about future education provision.

Face-to-face workshops have been scheduled as below:
